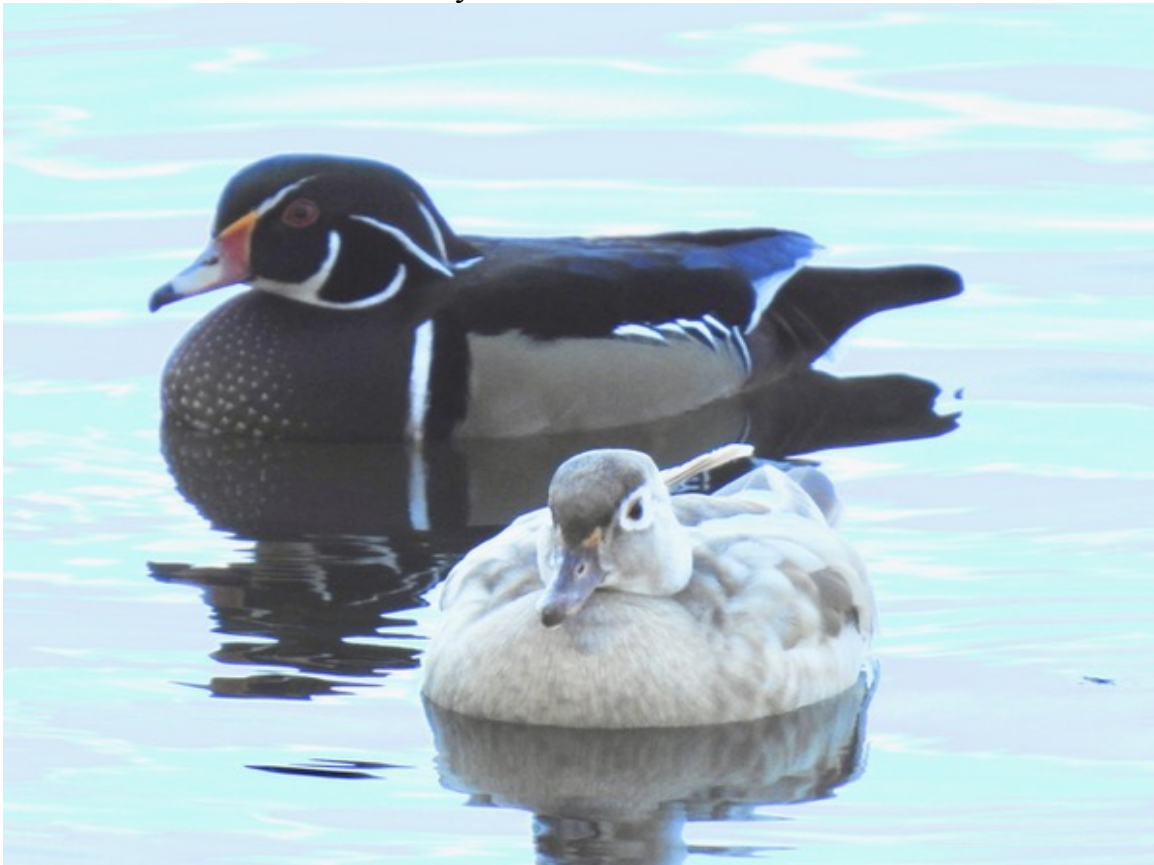
WOW! What a day at OWRP. I will send complete list out later today.

15 birders were treated to the BEST day of birding that I can remember. We usually go to Wetlands for “wetland” birds. However, today, we had flocks of small guys all over the park.

A few favorites: Yellow-bellied Sapsucker, Northern Flicker, Yellow-throated Warbler, Blue-headed Vireo, Sharp-shinned Hawk, Red-headed Woodpeckers, Wilson’s Snipe(s),

After OWRP 3 of us went to Tuscawilla Park for Wood Ducks, Muscovy, Hooded Mergansers, and I saw a Downy Woodpecker.

My favorite bird of the day - if you can have a favorite - was Wood Duck, ALBINO. This bird has been reported at Tuscawilla Park over the years, but I had never seen her until today.
