All,

An even dozen birders saw 35 species on the Bears Head Hammock and land fill bird walk. There are three stops on this walk. The Exxon station along 200 where we saw several Bluebirds and Pine warblers. Second, we drove and walked through the Bears Head Hammock area and were disappointed as the only bird seen was fly by Vulture. Our finally stop was at the Citrus landfill where we did not see a great verity of species but were treated to thousands of birds that had come for a free meal. We saw at lease 7 immature and 5 mature Bald Eagles, hundreds of Vultures, at lease a thousand gulls, and a great verity of black birds.
