I took one group and walked toward the famous Lopez driving range pond where a good number of American White Pelicans were spotted while Wendy's group walked from the Springdale Pool towards the Bald Eagle's nest.

No real surprises. All of us watched both Bald Eagles at the nest with one bird bringing in nesting material that appeared to be grass clippings. Low estimate of 90-100 Pelicans in the 3 ponds.

A couple of birders saw their first-ever Wilson's Snipe!
And the Ring-billed Gulls have finally arrived!
