Twenty two Birders Gathered at the P.A.R.E. Park Wildlife Conservation Area for a morning bird walk and managed to spot 34 species. The area is a fantastic Sparrow habitat and my guess is that there are as many as 8 or 10 different Sparrow species that can be seen there. This day it was not happening. The weather was cool, gray and not much was coming up. We started near the first parking area and had a small flurry of birds, Warblers, Finches, Gnatcatchers, but no sparrows. After birding that area we changed locations we drove farther down the road and had finally luck just before we quit for the day. Those that stayed to the end were rewarded with a tree full of RRBB and a wonderful sighting of a beautiful Swamp Sparrow and a Common Yellow-throat.
